Organisational overview

Project background

The project "EU training support to Libya's border security and management institutions" (hereby referred as EU-BMT-LY) is set out within the framework of the EU support to Libya, responding to a request of the Libyan authorities to receive EU support in the field of training on border management issues. The overall objective of the action is to contribute to the improvement of Libya's state services through the institutional development of the relevant border security and management training centre(s) aiming at improving migration and border management in line with core international human rights standards.

Objective

The Expert on Core Curriculum Development (hereby referred as CDE) will support to develop and/or update the contextually relevant training curriculum for Libyan law enforcement.

Tasks

The tasks to be completed by the Expert within this assignment are the following:

- Revise/redesign a core curriculum that addresses the needs of Libyan law enforcement agencies, incorporating national and international good practices.
- Develop a structured training framework that includes key areas such as human rights in border management, cross border crime prevention, investigation techniques, legal frameworks and cross-border cooperation.
- Collaborate closely with relevant Libyan border agencies, to ensure the curriculum is contextually relevant and addresses national requirements.
- Establish quality control mechanisms to evaluate and refine the training program as needed, ensuring long-term effectiveness.

Deliverables

The Expert is expected to provide the following deliverables:

- The Core Curriculum of the respective training institution is revised/redesigned and tailored to the needs of Libyan law enforcement, integrating national and international good practices.
- A structured training curriculum framework is developed, covering essential topics such as human rights in border management, cross-border crime prevention, investigation techniques, legal frameworks, and cross-border cooperation, etc. (based on the assessment)
- Stakeholder Engagement Sessions are conducted with Libyan border agencies to ensure the curriculum meets national requirements and practical needs.
- Quality control mechanisms are established to evaluate and refine the training program, ensuring its effectiveness and sustainability over time.

The final deliverables must be submitted no later than **31.12.2025**.

Reporting lines

The Expert will report to the Project Manager who will be in charge of the overall supervision both in terms of administrative and content issues and who will provide input and comments on deliverables as needed.

Qualifications and Experience

- Generic requirements
 - Minimum of 10 years of experience in curriculum development, specifically for law enforcement agencies or related security sectors.
 - o In-depth knowledge of international law enforcement standards and practices on border management.

- Proven ability to tailor training content to address region-specific operational and legal contexts, particularly in conflict-affected regions.
- Strong communication skills and experience in working with diverse stakeholders, including governmental agencies and international organisations.
- Specific requirements
 - Experience working with law enforcement agencies in North Africa or the Middle East is an advantage
- Language skills
 - o Proficient English (verbal and written) is a requirement. Arabic is an asset.

Travel
